

Borough Hall will remain open, but visitors are reminded that they should take advantage of online services available on www.ubnj.net and make contact with staff via phone or email where possible, instead of coming to the building in person. Public access to the administrative offices is restricted. DPW has continued to take further measures to expand the already extensive cleaning and sanitizing at all borough offices. The Police Department remains open 24/7 as usual but visitors are again reminded to take advantage of online services available at www.ubnj.net and make contact with department personnel via phone or email for routine non-emergent concerns. The dispatch window at Headquarters will remain open at this time. All emergency response agencies will continue to respond to calls for service as usual, but callers are reminded to provide detailed information to dispatch in the event of a call for service at a location where emergency responders may be exposed to COVID-19 or any other health hazard. During this type of emergency, panic and fear can add unnecessary danger to an already complicated situation. As previously stated UB-OEM will only be providing information approved by the CDC and the New Jersey Department of Health. Please take the following common-sense actions recommended to protect yourself and your community from the spread of COVID-19.

1. First and foremost, wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; and after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing.
2. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.
3. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
4. Stay home when you are sick.
5. Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
6. Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
